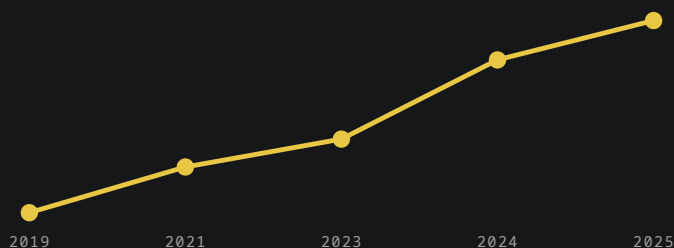

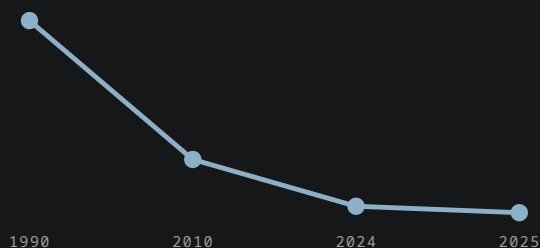

A regional view begins where two correct statistics stop telling the same story.

Busan can remain one of the world's largest container ports while losing residents, younger workers and metropolitan command functions. The contradiction is not a design problem. It is the reporting ground.

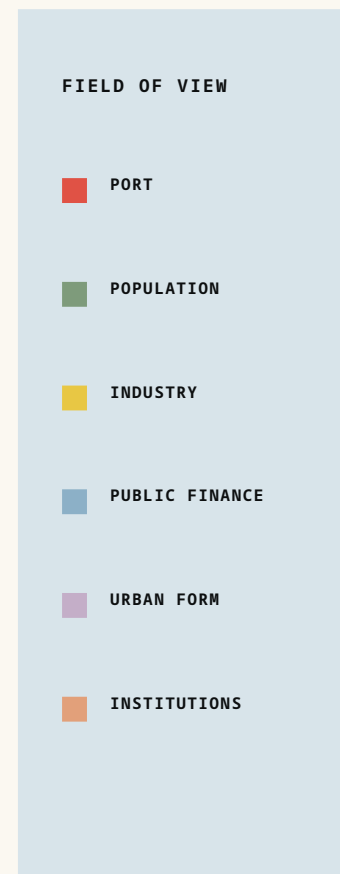
National policy becomes local here.

Busan is useful as a reporting ground because expansion and contraction can occur at the same time - and because national claims acquire a physical, fiscal and social form once they meet a particular place.

South Korea is commonly described through national indicators, national institutions and policy decisions made in Seoul. Those measures establish the broad dimensions of a problem, but their consequences become harder to read once they encounter a particular labor market, municipal budget, industrial base, housing market or pattern of population movement.

Busan brings several of those pressures together: a globally connected port economy, rapid aging, internal migration, large redevelopment projects, new residential districts and a continuing attempt to relocate public authority and higher-value economic functions. Regional reporting tests whether a national description remains analytically sufficient under those conditions.

The geographic base does not define the outer boundary of the journalism. National and international reporting enters when the same questions require a wider frame. The point is not to localize every story. It is to identify where scale changes the mechanism.

THE FRAMEWORK IS EDITORIAL, NOT DECORATIVE: EACH DISTANCE CHANGES WHAT CAN BE CLAIMED.

The headline is only the first layer.

Each question begins with a public claim that is broadly true. The newsroom's work starts with the boundary around that claim.

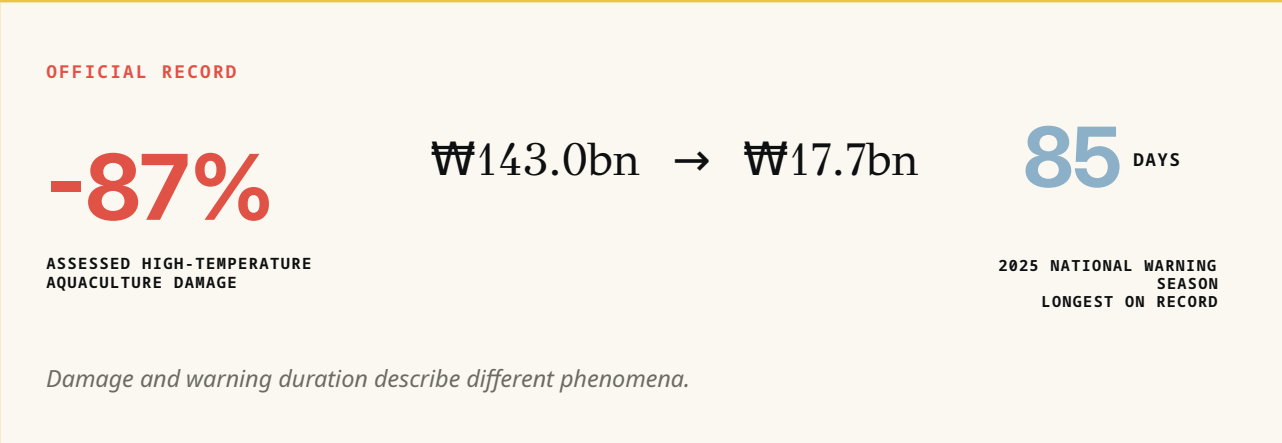

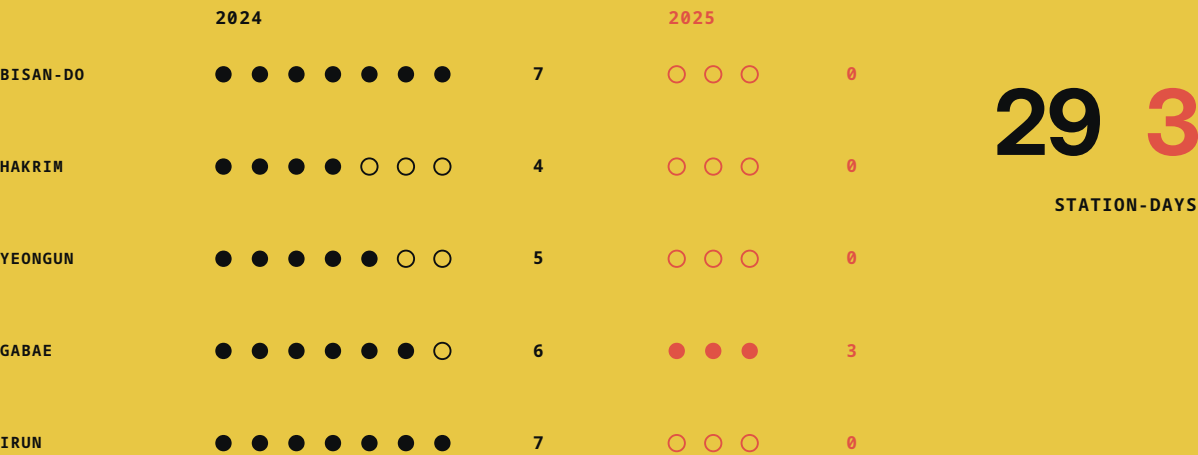
Define the claim. Test the scale. Follow the conversion. Keep the record open long enough to test it again.

BREEZE-DERIVED EXPOSURE MEASURE

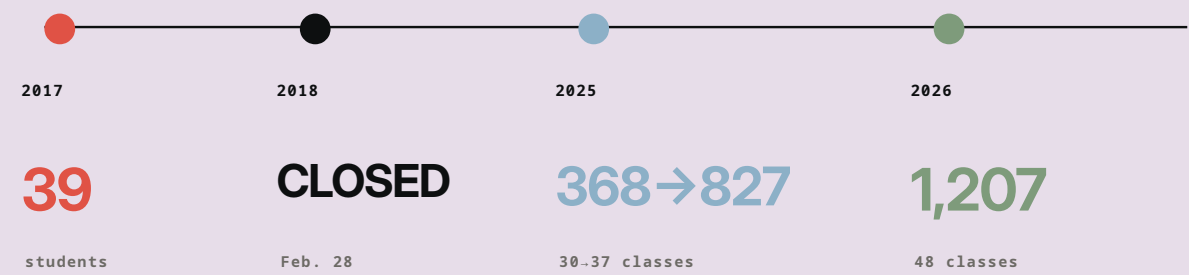
STATION-DAYS WITH DAILY MINIMUM > 28°C · AUGUST · SAME FIVE MONITORING LOCATIONS

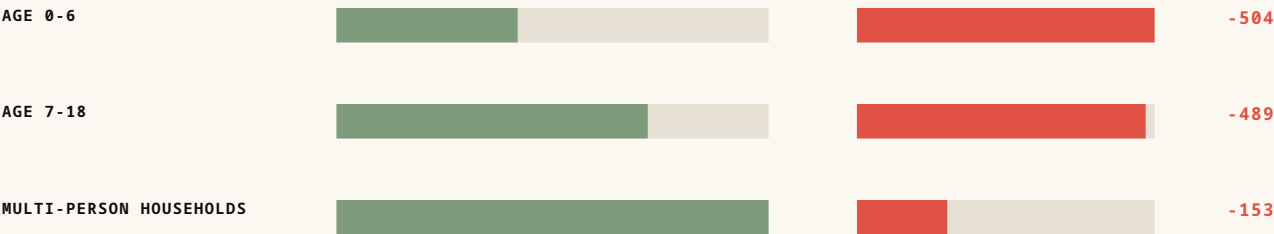

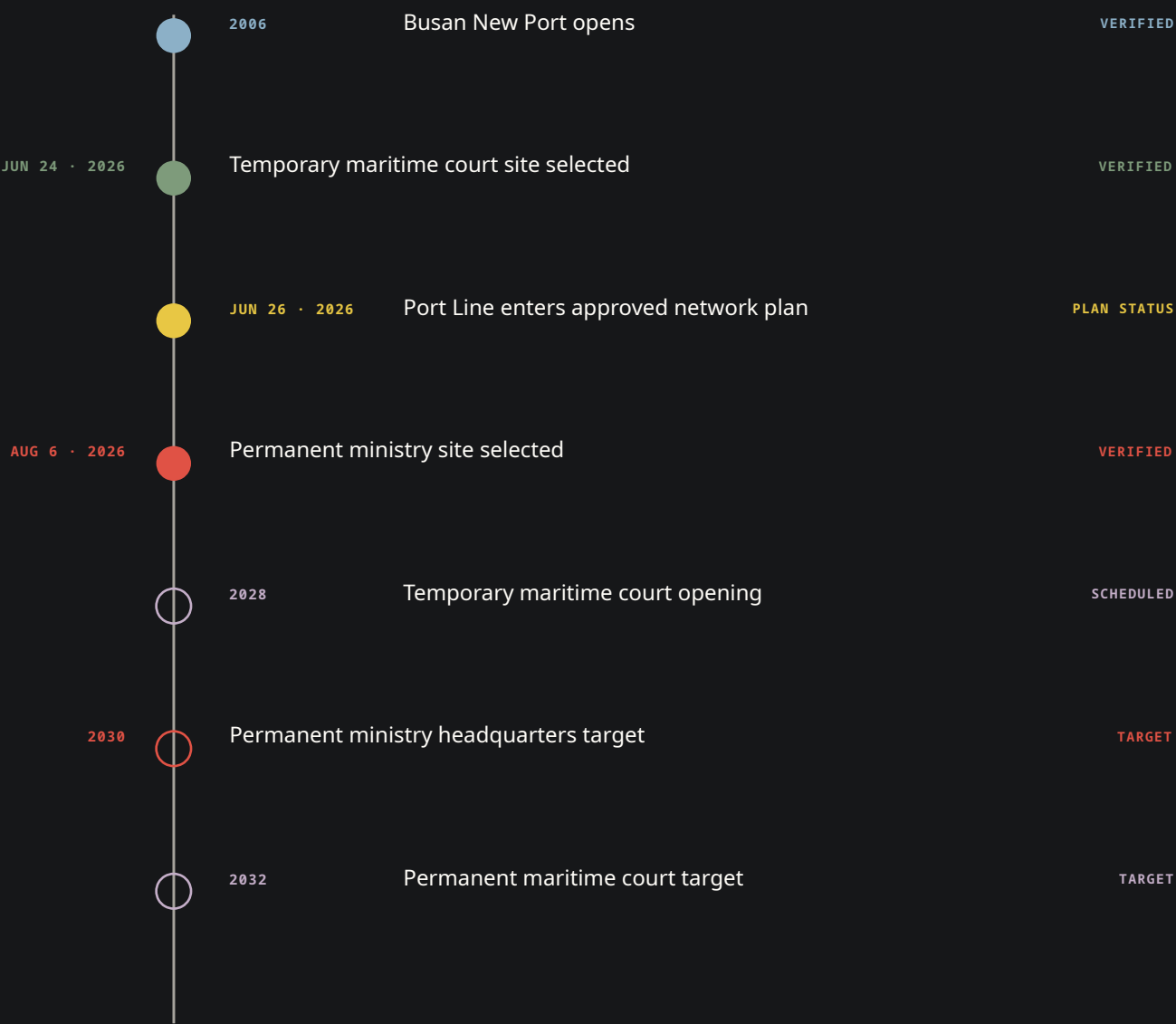

A Breeze File keeps earlier claims, verified milestones and future tests visible on the same record.



CURRENT QUESTION

Will institutions shift decisions, contracts and activity into Busan - or stop at new buildings on the waterfront?

The newsroom is designed to remember.

Different publishing forms carry different parts of the record. The distinction prevents every article from becoming an archive while keeping the archive available when the story moves again.
